

Bishop David Perrin Founder of NAAMC

Bishop David Perrin is not only the Founder of NAAMC, but he is also a visionary leader, kingdom builder, and compassionate communicator of the gospel of Jesus Christ. With a passion for making disciples, he has traveled to six continents planting churches throughout North America and Africa pursuing his desire to see the Great Commission fulfilled. In 1999 he established Boundless Ministries Inc. an organization focused on equipping, mobilizing, and resourcing churches and individuals for worldwide ministry. He is the Senior Pastor of Christ Kingdom Church located in Prince George's County, Maryland, and husband to Lady Allethia Perrin. Formally trained in the arts, Bishop Perrin is a graduate of Carnegie Mellon University and Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary. His simplistic eye-opening ministry style mixed with dramatic illustrations and prophetic insight make him a well sought-after conference speaker and ministry mentor. He is the founder of the National African American Missions Conference (NAAMC) and in 2018 launched the new International Missions Conference (IMC) to help nations equip leaders for cross-cultural missions.



Ted Esler Missio Nexus President

Ted Esler leads Missio Nexus, an association of agencies and churches from the US and Canada representing over 54,000 Great Commission workers worldwide. Ted worked as a computer consultant before becoming a church planter in Sarajevo, Bosnia, during the 1990s. From there he worked in various leadership positions in Pioneers. In 2015 he was appointed the President of Missio Nexus. Ted has a PhD in Intercultural Studies (Fuller Theological Seminary, 2012) and is the author of The Innovation Crisis: Creating Disruptive Influence in Ministry You Lead. Ted lives to see the church reclaim its role as a leader in innovation, just as Jesus led innovation in the 1st century.



Lily FieldAmbassadors Fellowshi
Executive Director
& Missionary

Lily Field is an African American, Certified Family Nurse Practitioner and missionary with over 17 years of full-time experience. She served as a full-time medical missionary in an orphanage for critically ill and abandoned children in Haiti for nine years. Her mission was to raise up disciples for Christ that would go to the unreached nations. She did this by meeting their need for a mother, healthcare and intensive discipleship and through expressing the love of God to the children. After 9 years, she was called to reach Muslims for Christ, which she did through an international student outreach in the US. She was also called to reach under-reached populations in the U.S., through work-place evangelism, focusing on populations such as the homeless and incarcerated. In 2016, Lily became a full-time mission's leader with Ambassador's Fellowship, Inc (AFI) and in 2019 became the new Executive Director. She is stationed in the U.S. but travels around the world to recruit, train and send equipped missionary teams to unreached nations. She continues to minister in Haiti, while expanding her ministry to the Muslim, Hindu, and Buddhist dominated regions of the world and locally with discipleship groups.

Lily is a passionate missions speaker and writer and teacher of the Perspectives world missions course.

Dave, 31 year-old young man is now a full-time missionary with Finish The Task International, a prayer and missions base with the intent of equipping and sending young adult leaders to make disciples amongst the unreached through worship, prayer, and church planting.

After surrendering his life to the Lord in 2012, David began ministering to those experiencing homelessness, victims of sexual abuse, and at-risk children in the inner city. This opened the door for him to go on his first mission trip to Panama where God confirmed his calling to the nations. David graduated from the Finish the Task Mission School in 2014 and completed two ten-week outreaches in Lebanon and Dubai. He is one of the few African Americans to serve in a Middle East location in the last decade where he and his team dedicated themselves to intercession and proclamation of the gospel.

In 2015, as part of a six-person mission team, David was sent to East Africa to start a church plant and a Missions and Prayer Training School for local Africans to know God and make Jesus known in the Horn of Africa.

David is in North Africa currently, focusing on worship, evangelism, church planting, discipleship, and youth ministry. He is a worship leader and has utilized his passion for dance to reach and mentor youth. David relocated from East Africa to North Africa in 2019, pursuing his long term vision of reaching refugees, migrants and people who are held captive in modern day slavery, with the Gospel of the kingdom.



Sonji Y. Pass TMS Global Regional Director of Church Culture

Rev. Sonji Y. Pass is the Regional Director of Church Culture at TMS Global. Prior to joining staff she served as a cross-cultural worker in Kenya for over 12 years. She is passionate about culture, hospitality, the nations, and reconciliation. Over the past 20 years, she has trained and led numerous mission teams, co-founded a church planting/discipleship school in remote Kenya and spoken at various conferences and retreats across the globe. Sonji has received extensive intercultural development training and holds a degree in Intercultural Studies. She brings the unique combination of experiences having served as a missionary, on staff at a church, and inside mission agencies as she helps awaken congregations to their important role in missions. Sonji believes that all people are created by God with purpose, value and intrinsic worth. Her great desire is for all humanity to see themselves through the eyes of the One who created them!

Jonathan Thomas
Civil Righteousness
President & Missionary

Jonathan Tremaine Thomas is an actor, activist, pastor, producer, social entrepreneur, fifth-generation "preacher's kid", and the grand-nephew of the legendary Civil Rights artist Dr. Nina Simone.

In 2003, after earning a B.S. Communications at East Carolina University and pursuing an M.A. in Intercultural Studies at Fuller Theological Seminary; he was commissioned as a full-time missionary to the most violent neighborhoods in Nashville, TN. He gained a voice nationally due to his peacemaking efforts during the 2014 civil unrest in Ferguson, Missouri; which led to the founding of CivilRighteousness, Inc. and a national reconciliation movement.

He then moved to Ferguson where he currently resides with his family directing prayer-fueled evangelism, community transformation, and racial reconciliation initiatives while serving on the pastoral team at Destiny Church St.Louis. With a strong conviction to "earnestly contend for the faith"; Jonathan carries an uncompromising message of identity in Christ and eternal perspective.



Jimmy McGee The Impact Movement President

James is often referred to as Jimmy McGee. He was born in Milwaukee, and later moved with his family to the Southside of Chicago where he grew up. He returned to Milwaukee to attend Marquette University, graduating with a Bachelors of Art in Sociology. After college, he re-located to Atlanta, Georgia to serve with InterVarsity Christian Fellowship. For ten years he served Black students who attended the Atlanta University Center. (The Atlanta University Center is a consortium of Historically Black Schools, Morehouse College, Clark Atlanta University, Spelman College and Morris Brown College.) In that capacity he has impacted college students' lives through mentoring, training, and directing conferences. During his tenure with InterVarsity he had other responsibilities before leaving InterVarsity December 2004. His last role was as the Director, Pilgrimage For Reconciliation (2002-2004): a program to help InterVarsity grow deeper in its intent to become a welcoming organization to all ethnic communities by looking at racial/ethnic conflict domestically and globally through the lens of Shalom Theology.

Jimmy is now the CEO/President of the The Impact Movement, Inc. Similar to his work with InterVarsity. The Impact Movement is a 501(c)3 ministry that is focused on reaching Black students in the academy. Formerly associated and linked with Cru, formerly known as Campus Crusade for Christ. Impact is in partnership with Cru, serving students at HBCU's, Primarily Black Institutions, and Primarily White Institutions.

Jimmy has a Masters of Arts in Applied Anthropology from Georgia State University. Jimmy is the founder and president of The Bitumen Group, Inc. Married to Genie, together they have 3 sons; James (Jay), Noah Aslan, and Asher Cross.
